Acts 2.38-47 (NRSV)

one of you in the name of Jesus Christ so that your sins may be forgiven; and you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit. ³⁹ For the promise is for you, for your children, and for all who are far away, everyone whom the Lord our God calls to him." ⁴⁰ And he testified with many other arguments and exhorted them, saying, "Save yourselves from this corrupt generation." ⁴¹ So those who welcomed his message were baptized, and that day about three thousand persons were added. ⁴² They devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and fellowship, to the breaking of bread and the prayers.

⁴³ Awe came upon everyone, because many wonders and signs were being done by the apostles. ⁴⁴ All who believed were together and had all things in common; ⁴⁵ they would sell their possessions and goods and distribute the proceeds to all, as any had need. ⁴⁶ Day by day, as they spent much time together in the temple, they broke bread at home and ate their food with glad and generous hearts, ⁴⁷ praising God and having the goodwill of all the people. And day by day the Lord added to their number those who were being saved.

POINTS TO PONDER: Wisdom is less about what you know and more about how you live in response to this. Many have offered their thoughts on what this means, for example:

The Bible gives us a range of wisdom literature including Job and Ecclesiastes but the book of Proverbs is where most of us will turn when wondering about wisdom for living well. This is in part because it is tried and tested wisdom with Solomon (the wise King) being the most likely candidate for much of what it offers—see Proverbs 10.1 & 25.1. The Bible's wisdom reflects that of many of the cultures of its time—such as that of Egypt, which suggests that there is something universal about the way in which life speaks to us and gives us particular ways of looking at this, based on our experience of living it. This is true today of course as we can find here ancient wisdom that keeps speaking to us still—if you have time, explore proverbs Chapter 10-22.

The fear of the Lord is the beginning of knowledge; fools despise wisdom and instruction. Prov 1.7

Key to the Bibles view of wisdom is that it is all about learning how to live wisely. Proverbs suggests that this is about seeing God working through wisdom, with it serving to help us let God be God and live learning what it means then to know Him, serve Him and Love Him.

Before we ask how we can be wise in our actions at Holy Redeemer? consider how you have grown in wisdom and what you would offer Solomon to be included in his Proverbs for today.

Think about the wisdom that can serve to guide yourself and others in:

Family life and relationships...

Caring for yourself...

Work, Professional life and Business...

In daily life and living...

Making choices and decisions...

Growing up...

And what other areas would you include?
